2019 Flood Related General Election Issues

Texas Legislation Ballot Measures Passed

Proposition 2 – Allows the Texas Water Development Board to issue up to \$200 million in bonds.

Proposition 3— Authorizes temporary property tax exemption for disaster areas.

Proposition 8— Creates a Flood Infrastructure Fund

Fort Bend County \$83 Million Flood Bond Referendum Approved

Allows the Fort Bend County Drainage District to borrow money for 25 flooding and drainage projects. As a result, the district will not have to raise taxes. Many of the projects are based on approval of state or federal grant money. The grant money will translate into nearly \$260 million worth of projects.


Flood Tunnel Passes Initial Feasibility Study

Willow Fork Drainage District

Continues the \$4.2MM desilt project for the 2nd half of the Diversion Channel in the Cinco Ranch area of Katy. Approximately 130,000 cubic yards out of 181,000 cubic yards of material have been removed from the channel, and 60,000 cubic yards have been transported off site. Allgood Construction, the contractor for this project, anticipates completion around the end of summer. Weather permitting
